Hi, congratulations on learning a great song, it is really fun to play, especially because everyone knows this song and love listening to it. Sing along as well if you can.

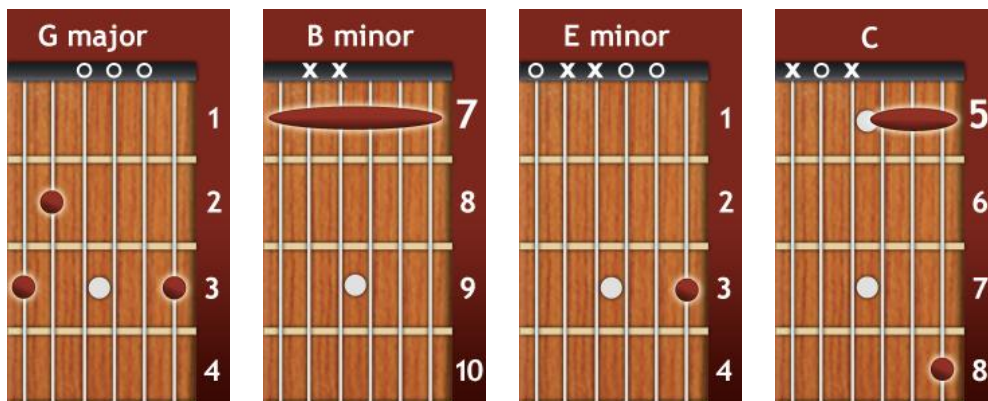
Now the secret to being able to play this song is getting your chord changes quick enough to make the song play fluently, so work on it a lot.

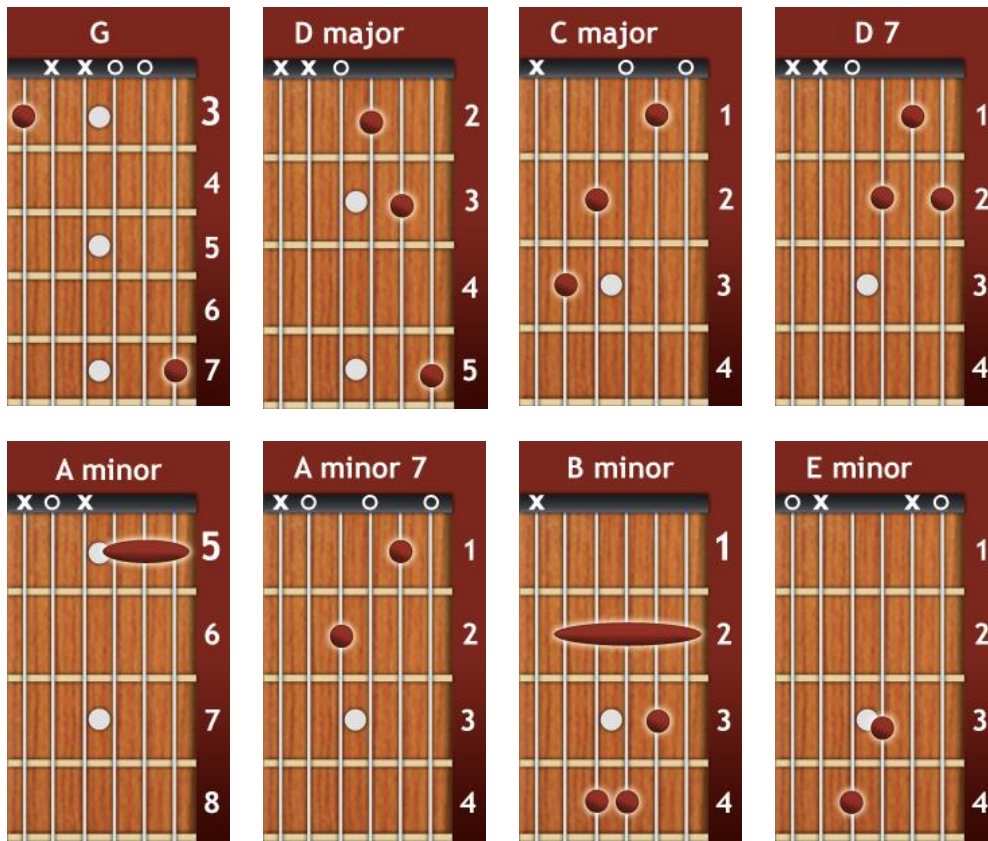

These are the chords you'll be using during the Can't Help Falling in Love. There are many, but don't worry, you only have to learn them once, and they're yours for life! There are 2 hard chords, the stretch G and D, which will give you some trouble, but work at it, and it'll get easier and easier.:

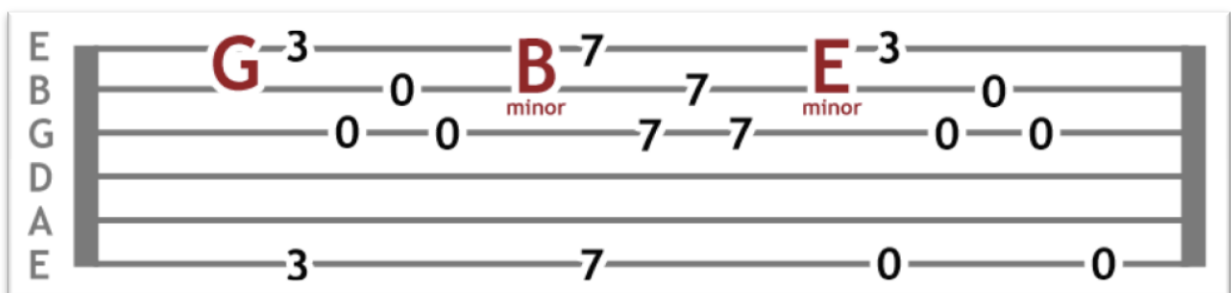





Tabs








